In 2002 the Lawrence Brothers Science Camp was founded through a generous donation from the John and Amy Bowles Lawrence Foundation and support from the University of South Dakota Foundation. From 2006 through 2011, the camp received grant support from Battelle. Currently, the camp is supported by fees and the South Dakota Biomedical Research Infrastructure Network (SD BRIN).

A broad theme is chosen each year that includes aspects of physical science, chemistry, life science, mathematics, and the health sciences.

The goal of the camp is to inspire students and to give them hands-on opportunities to conduct experiments designed to challenge them and show them that science is fun.
